Lending, Services, and Community Investment

USDA

The Murray Bank has access to Rural Housing loans through the USDA. These loans can have a LTV of up to 100% of the appraised value.

VA Loans

The Murray Bank has access to VA loans. The loans can have a LTV of up to 100% with no PMI.

FHA Loans

The Murray Bank has access to FHA loans that allow low down payment, higher DTI and lower credit scores for borrowers.

Home Ready

The Murray Bank has access to Home Ready loans with as low as 3% down with lower interest rate based on lower income qualifications.

Resident Safety

A loan was made to purchase a pumper truck and to refinance their building to better protect the residents of Calloway County from damaging fires.

Youth Safety

A loan was extended to a Youth Center. The center is a hang out spot for low to moderate income kids. The director and his volunteers strive to provide a place for these kids in hopes they stay out of trouble.

Murray Calloway County Economic Development Corporation (EDC)

One bank employee and one bank board members serve on the local board of the EDC. The Murray Bank also makes an \$8,000 annual donation to the EDC. The purpose of the EDC is to recruit new industry and to create jobs in Murray and Calloway County.

Murray Calloway County Industrial Development Authority (IDA)

One bank board member serves on the local board of the IDA.

Monetary Instruments & Check Cashing

The Murray Bank is one of the few banks, possibly the only bank, in the local market that sells monetary instruments to non-customers. These are used by people that do not have

checking accounts, etc. The Murray Bank also cashes checks for non-customers and does not charge the elderly to cash their US Treasury checks.

Free Account

The Murray Bank offers a free checking account. There is no service charge. We also offer the first ATM/Debit card for free. Online banking, mobile banking and mobile deposit are also free. Low to moderate income families could have 24 hour free access to their accounts (they may have internet charges).

Community Investment

The Murray Bank looks for opportunities to invest locally. See attached list of current investments.

Kentucky IOLTA Fund

At the request of KBA's IOLTA Board of Trustee representative, The Murray Bank has raised the interest rate paid on IOLTA accounts to 1.49% per annum with no service charges.

Calloway County and Murray Independent School Systems

The Murray Bank offers two debit cards with the logos of each school on the face of the card (see insert). Customers of The Murray Bank choose which school themed card they would like to carry. With each swipe of the new debit cards, The Murray Bank will share the fee income per transaction with the school of the customer's choice. To date, The Murray Bank has donated \$254,000 to each school as part of this agreement in 2010.

American Legion Post #73

The Murray Bank has partnered with the American Legion Post #73 to receive funds to provide ramps to improve home accessibility for mobility-restricted homeowners. These are usually for low income citizens.

MCCH Hospice House

The Murray Bank has donated \$125,000. The Hospice House is used by people of all income brackets and is a very needed part of the community.

FHLB Welcome Home Program

FHLB offers a welcome home program to first time homebuyers with income limits. The Murray Bank works with FHLB to offer this program to our borrowers.

Hazel Office

With the news that Hazel, KY was losing their one and only bank, The Murray Bank decided to open a branch there. Since the residents of Hazel had grown accustomed to having financial services in their community, The Murray Bank saw it as an opportunity to bank a soon to be unbanked town. Had we not decided to branch, that community would be without a bank or the financial services they so rightly deserve.

Resident Safety

The Murray Bank funded a construction and then the permanent financing of a Fire Station to better serve the residents on the north end of town.

Industrial Development

The Murray Bank has partnered with another bank in town to finance the permanent financing of TPG Plastics. The building is approximately 60,000 square feet, currently employs 70 and is still growing operations.

TVA/West Ky Allied Services

As a member of the Federal Home Loan Bank, The Murray Bank has partnered with TVA and West Ky Allied Services to help low income and disabled community members rehabilitate their homes with energy efficient items such as a new roof, windows, hot water heater and heating/air units. The members must be part of the West Ky Rural Electric Co-op and be of low income or disabled to qualify.

Secondary Education Opportunity

The Murray Bank's CEO has joined a group of area CEOs and school superintendents in hopes to create a better prepared workforce for the community. Local superintendents are actively engaged to see if there are opportunities in their high schools to teach the skills students needs to enter the workforce upon graduation and be successful.

Payroll Protection Program (PPP)

The Murray Bank leapt into action when the PPP was rolled out. Since the Bank was not an SBA lender, there were several hoops that had to be jumped through. In the end, the Bank took 1,291 applications totaling \$32,767,868 for customers and non-customers. There were no other banks in town making PPP loans to non-customers.

Addiction Recovery

The Murray Bank funded the purchase of a recovery facility located in Calloway County. The facility focuses on rehabilitation and short-term residential transition housing. This facility accepts Medicare and Medicaid helping those in all income brackets.

Economic Development

The Murray Bank funded a loan to the local airport for repairs. As this is the only local airport, it allows for the air transport to this region for commerce and development visits.

Murray Calloway County Parks

The Murray Bank committed to donating \$500,000 to the Murray Calloway County Parks to provide lighting to the soccer complex and help restore the swimming pool. The Murray Bank committed to donating an additional \$150,000 to restore the concession stand at the Baseball Complex.

Reality Store

The local extension office prepares a real-life budgeting fair for 7th and 10th graders at the local schools. The event is designed to give the students the opportunity to make life choices for a simulated "month". The students open pretend checking accounts and have to budget

for items such as housing, transportation, child care, groceries, etc. Employees of The Murray Bank man the “Bank” and advise students on best budgeting practices and the importance of saving for unexpected events. This simulation is provided to free/reduced lunch schools.

Junior Achievement

We have 10 employees who are teaching financial literacy through the Junior Achievement program. The lessons have been provided to over 400 students at both Calloway County and Murray City Schools. Both schools are free/reduced lunch schools.

Veteran Safety

A loan has been made to the dedication to prevention of suicide in Vets.

Disaster Recovery

The Murray Bank has participated in a loan to rebuild power, water, and sewer services in a FEMA Disaster Area.

Disaster Recovery

The Murray Bank made a loan to finance a piece of equipment that will help with Mayfield, KY clean-up.
